## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This month we are all about color. Two books from the worlds of fashion and quilting offer delicious combinations as inspiration:

A new book by Kaffe Fassett, "Simple Shapes Spectacular Quilts," shows a dazzling display of his distinctive work: A pieced quilt of harlequin shapes in neon patterns and colors; dreamy blue-on-blue rectangles stacked like bricks, then topped with floating islands of pattern. His eye for color dazzles once again, and it is unforgettable.

In the 1950s, a textile company started by New York couple Carl and Iris Apfel gave them an excuse to travel everywhere for inspiration, buying fabrics, trinkets, needlepoint, clothing, rugs and jewelry. Iris wore her finds as walking art, dazzling New York society for years. In 2007, the clothes closet of this daring stylista was raided for a museum retrospective. Her astonishing array of garments, jewelry and accessories caused a sensation.

A companion book, "Rare Bird of Fashion: The Irreverent Iris Apfel" captures her marvelous garb and fantastic eye for color. It is the confident color and textile combinations dreamed up and worn by her, no ordinary clothes horse, that make for such delicious viewing:

- -- A ruffled, floor-length dress made of three huge silk taffeta tiers: first topaz, then cinnamon, then gunmetal.
- -- An evening jacket sprouting a huge cloud of wispy feathers in tangerine, purple, black, persimmon and olive.
- -- A full-skirted dress of olive green silk dotted with big red polka dots and worn over glittery silver stockings and paprika silk shoes.
- -- A boiled wool jacket in fuschia, worn laden with ropes and ropes of turquoise necklaces, bracelets and belt.
- -- Tribal jewelry studded in stones of coral, turquoise, amber and jadeite.

You get the idea. Yummy colors and glorious gems. Wild, wonderful combinations that take you to another planet. Enough color inspiration to get a stitcher's thoughts rushing to the studio. Enjoy!
